According to the Mental Health Information Center of the National Mental Health Association:

- More than 48 million Americans have a mental disorder in any given year, although fewer than 8 million seek treatment.
- During the course of any given year, more than 44.5 million adult Americans are affected by one or more mental illnesses.
- The majority of Americans (70%) rebuff the false notion that childhood mental health problems are really the result of poor parenting.
- One in every five children have a diagnosable mental emotional or behavioral disorder and up to 1 in 10 may suffer from a serious disturbance. Seventy percent of children, however, do not receive mental health service.
- More than 16 million adults age 18 to 54 in the United States suffer from anxiety disorder, which include panic disorder, obsessive-compulsive disorder, social phobia, and generalized anxiety disorder.
